Traveling I - 91 North – Take Exit 15. At the end of the exit ramp, turn left onto Route 68 West. Proceed to 7th traffic light (intersection of Route 68 and North Main Street Extension). Take a left turn onto North Main Street Extension. At the first traffic light, take a left into driveway of 860/866. At the top of the hill proceed to the building straight ahead.

Traveling I - 91 South –Take Exit 15. At the end of the exit ramp, turn right onto Route 68 West. Proceed to 6th traffic light (intersection of Route 68 and North Main Street Extension). Take a left turn onto North Main Street Extension. At the first traffic light, take a left into driveway of 860/866. At the top of the hill proceed to the building straight ahead.

Wilbur Cross Parkway (Route 15 Going North)
Exit 66

At the end of the exit ramp, turn left onto Route 5 South. Proceed approximately ¼ mile to the 3rd traffic light, following signs to Route 68. At top of hill, turn left on Route 68 East. At first traffic light, turn right onto North Main Street Extension. At the first traffic light, take a left at the driveway of 860/866. At the top of the hill proceed to the building straight ahead.

Wilbur Cross Parkway (Route 15 Going South)
Exit 66

At the end of the exit ramp, turn left onto Route 5 South. Proceed approximately ¼ mile to the 5th traffic light, following sign to Route 68. At top of hill turn left on Route 68 East. At first traffic light, turn right onto North Main Street Extension. At the traffic light, take a left at the driveway of 860/866. At the top of the hill proceed to the building straight ahead.

From Interstate 84: Exit 27

Proceed on Route 691 East to the Wilbur Cross Parkway Southbound and follow directions above.
